HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (15/07/2020)

- The country is in Stage 4 of the State of Emergency (29 June 2020 -17 September 2020)
- O Walvis Bay, Swakopmund, and Arandis Local Authority Areas in Erongo region will remain in Stage 3 (from 07 July 2020 until 23h59 of 03 August 2020).




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 15 July 2020

Namibia has recorded a total of 1032 COVID-19 cases since 13 March 2020. Up to 339 (32.8%) of the total cases were recorded during week 28 (Figure 1).

- A high number of cases were recorded in the past three weeks as a result of:
 - -Spread of local transmission in Walvis Bay district
 - -Increased Active Case Search and testing, averaging 300 daily in the past few days.
- Call centre continues operation for 24 hours daily; 1294 calls were answered with 23 alerts, today.
- Cumulatively, 980 (95.0%) cases are local transmissions while 52 (5.0) are imported.
- O Since the beginning of the outbreak, 195 cases were identified during active case search.
- Eight of the 14 regions have reported confirmed cases with Erongo region reporting the highest number of cases; 960 (93.0%).
- More female cases 517 (50.1%) were recorded compared to male cases 515 (49.9%).

EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION IN NAMIBIA




Figure 2: Distribution of suspected and confirmed COVID-19 cases in Namibia by District, 15 July 2020

- Eight (8) regions have reported confirmed cases; with Erongo reporting the highest 960 (93.0%) followed by Khomas 35 (3.4%).
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 2620 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 289 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours. Cumulatively, 1201 contacts have completed their 14 days of follow up, while 958 out of 1123 active contacts were monitored today.




Figure 3: Age and sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 15 July 2020

- The most affected ages are within 20 and 49 years 812 (78.7%).
- Those aged 60 and above constitute 20 (1.9%) of those affected.

- Since March 2020, 4509
 people have been placed into
 supervised quarantine
 facilities around the country.
- A total of 653 people are currently in quarantine with 7 new admissions in the past 24 hours.
- Since March 2020, 99 people who were in quarantine have tested positive for COVID-19.

- A total of 356 trucks entered the country through various ground crossing points in the last 24 hours.
- Of these trucks, 46.1% were heading to Khomas, 24.4% to //Kharas while 15.4% were heading to Erongo region.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION

- Regions have enhanced social mobilization on COVID-19
- Targeted testing in Walvis Bay is ongoing
- Regions have intensified surveillance on travellers from Erongo region for early case detection

CHALLENGES

- Inadequate isolation units, at health facilities in the regions.
- O Inadequate PPE
- Inadequate nasopharyngeal swabs and appropriate transport media.
- Prolonged turn-around time of results at NIP.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Establish fully equipped isolation units at health facilities in the regions.
- Logistics pillar to continue with the procurement and distribution of sufficient PPE to the regions to ensure that response is not interrupted.
- NIP to continue sourcing for swabs and appropriate transport media.
- Enhance laboratory testing capacity throughout the country
