- The country is in Stage 4 of the State of Emergency (29 June 2020 -17 September 2020)
- O Walvis Bay, Swakopmund, and Arandis Local Authority Areas in Erongo region will remain in Stage 3 (from 07 July 2020 until 23h59 of 03 August 2020).

To-date, 15 Health Care Workers have tested positive for COVID-19, with 3 new confirmations today.

- Omusati region has recorded its first COVID-19 case today (19 July 2020).
- One death has been recorded today (19 July 2020) from Erongo region.
- ⊙ Today (19 July 2020), 7 recoveries have been recorded from Erongo (4), //Kharas (2), and Khomas (1) regions.
- O Cumulatively, 1283 (95.5%) cases are local transmissions while 61 (4.5%) are imported.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 215 cases were identified during active case search.
- More male cases 737 (54.8%) were recorded compared to female cases 607 (45.2%)

Nine (9) of the 14 regions have reported confirmed cases; with Erongo reporting the highest 1258 (93.6%) followed by Khomas 39 (2.9%).

EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION IN NAMIBIA




Figure 2: Distribution of suspected and confirmed COVID-19 cases in Namibia by District, 19 July 2020




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases 19 July 2020

Namibia has recorded 1344 COVID-19 cases since 13 March 2020. Up to 534 (39.7%) of the total cases were recorded during week 29 (Figure 1).

- A high number of cases were recorded in the past three weeks as a result of:
 - -Spread of local transmission in Walvis Bay district -Increased Active Case Search and testing, averaging 300 daily in the past weeks.
- Call centre continues operation for 24 hours daily. Today, 1380 calls were answered with 7 alerts.
- The most affected ages are within 20 and 49 years 1036 (77.1%).
- Those aged 60 and above constitute 33 (2.5%) of those affected.




Figure 3: Age and sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 19 July 2020

- Since March 2020, 4701 people have been placed into supervised quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 651 people are currently in quarantine with 6 new admissions in the past 24 hours.
- Since March 2020, 107
 people who were in
 quarantine have tested
 positive for COVID-19.

Table 3: COVID-19 specimen recorded at NIP & Path care Laboratories 19 July 2020

- To date, 18507 tests have been conducted by NIP & Path-Care laboratories (including 1903 re-tests).
- Since the beginning of the outbreak,
 3413 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 80 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours.
- Cumulatively, 1237 contacts have completed their 14 days of follow up, while 407 out of 1881 active contacts were monitored today.

- A total of 315 trucks entered the country through various ground crossing points in the last 24 hours.
- Of these trucks, 43.5% were heading to Khomas, 20.6% to Erongo while 20.3% were heading to //Kharas region.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION

- National level continues to support the regions
- Regions have enhanced social mobilization on COVID-19
- Targeted testing in Walvis Bay is ongoing
- Regions have intensified surveillance on travellers from Erongo region for early case detection

CHALLENGES

- Inadequate isolation units, at health facilities in the regions.
- O Inadequate PPE
- Inadequate nasopharyngeal swabs and appropriate transport media.
- Prolonged turn-around time of results at NIP.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Establish fully equipped isolation units at health facilities in the regions.
- O Logistics pillar to continue with the procurement and distribution of sufficient PPE to the regions to ensure that response is not interrupted.
- NIP to continue sourcing for swabs and appropriate transport media.
- Enhance laboratory testing capacity throughout the country
