HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (25/07/2020)

- The country is in Stage 4 of the State of Emergency (29 June 2020 -17 September 2020)
- Walvis Bay, Swakopmund, and Arandis Local Authority Areas in Erongo region will remain in Stage 3 (from 07 July 2020 until 23h59 of 03 August 2020).

Eleven (11) of the 14 regions have reported confirmed cases; with Erongo reporting the highest
 1638 (92.2%) followed by Khomas 70 (3.9%).

- Today (25/07/2020), 3 recoveries have been recorded, 1 Erongo and 2 Khomas region.
- One fatality was recorded today (25/07/2020) in Erongo Region .
- To-date, 30 Health Care Workers have tested positive for COVID-19.
- Cumulatively, 1705 (96.1%) cases are local transmissions while 70 (3.9%) are imported.
- Up to 978 confirmed cases in Erongo region are still to be placed in isolation facilities.
- More male cases 1013 (57.1%) were recorded compared to female cases 762 (42.9%)




Figure 1: Distribution of suspected and confirmed COVID-19 cases in Namibia by District, 25 July 2020

- The most affected ages are within 20 and 49 years 1367 (77%).
- Those aged 60 and above constitute 43 (2.4%)
 of those affected.

- To date, 22697 tests have been conducted by NIP & Path-Care laboratories (including 2354 retests).
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 4306 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 32 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours.
- Cumulatively, 1355 contacts have completed their 14 days of follow up, while 292 out of 2520 active contacts were monitored today.



Figure 2: Age and sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 25 July 2020




Figure 3: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases 25 July 2020

Namibia has recorded 1775 COVID-19 cases since 13 March 2020. Up to 534 (30.1%) of the total cases were recorded during week 29 (Figure 3).

- A high number of cases were recorded in the past three weeks as a result of:
 - -Spread of local transmission in Walvis Bay district
 - -Enhanced Active Case Search and testing, averaging 300 tests daily in the past weeks.
- Call centre continues operation for 24 hours daily. Today, 1341 calls were answered including 12 alerts.

Table 3: Number of people in mandatory quarantine facilities, 25 July 2020

- Since March 2020, 5097
 people have been placed into
 supervised quarantine
 facilities around the country.
- A total of 701 people are currently in quarantine with 65 new admissions in the past 24 hours.
- Since March 2020, 119 people who were in quarantine have tested positive for COVID-19.

- A total of 339 trucks entered the country through various ground crossing points in the last 24 hours.
- Of these trucks, 42.7% were heading to Khomas,
 12.3% to //Kharas while
 28.3% were heading to Erongo region.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION

- A high-level delegation team has been sent to Erongo region on 22 July 2020, to engage stakeholders on the impact of COVID-19 in the region.
- O National level continues to support the regions
- Regions have enhanced social mobilization on COVID-19
- Targeted testing in Walvis Bay is ongoing
- Regions have intensified surveillance on travellers from Erongo region for early case detection

CHALLENGES

- Inadequate Human resources in the regions
- Inadequate ICU facilities and ICU equipment in the regions
- Inadequate isolation units, at health facilities in the regions.
- O Inadequate PPE
- Inadequate nasopharyngeal swabs and appropriate transport media.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- The Ministry to fast track the appointment of critical positions for the response in the regions
- Provision of fully equipped ICU facilities in the regions.
- Establish fully equipped isolation units at health facilities in the regions.
- O Logistics pillar to continue with the procurement and distribution of sufficient PPE to the regions to ensure that response is not interrupted.
- NIP to continue sourcing for swabs and appropriate transport media.
