HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (27/07/2020)

- The country is in Stage 4 of the State of Emergency (29 June 2020 -17 September 2020)
- Walvis Bay, Swakopmund, and Arandis Local Authority Areas in Erongo region will remain in Stage 3 (from 07 July 2020 until 23h59 of 03 August 2020).

Twelve (12) of the 14 regions have reported confirmed cases; with Erongo reporting the highest 1759 (91.8%) followed by Khomas 80 (4.2%).

- ◆ Kavango East region has recorded its first COVID-19 case today (27/07/2020)
- Three recoveries have been recorded from Erongo region today (27/07/2020)
- To-date, 36 Health Care Workers have tested positive for COVID-19, with 2 new confirmations today.
- Cumulatively, 1846 (96.3%) cases are local transmissions while 71 (3.7%) are imported.
- Up to 1099 confirmed cases in Erongo region are still to be placed in isolation facilities.
- More male cases 1117 (58.3%) were recorded compared to female cases 800 (41.7%)




Figure 1: Distribution of suspected and confirmed COVID-19 cases in Namibia by District, 27 July 2020




Figure 2: Age and sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, 27 July 2020

- To date, 25220 tests have been conducted by NIP & Path-Care laboratories (including 2449 retests).
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 4683 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 98 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours.
- Cumulatively, 1420 contacts have completed their 14 days of follow up, while 906 out of 2969 active contacts were monitored today.
- The most affected ages are within 20 and 49 years 1491(77.8%).
- Those aged 60 and above constitute 47
 (2.5%) of those affected.




Figure 3: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases 27 July 2020

Namibia has recorded 1917 COVID-19 cases since 13 March 2020. Up to 534 (27.9%) of the total cases were recorded during week 29 (Figure 3).

- A high number of cases were recorded in the past three weeks as a result of:
 - -Spread of local transmission in Walvis Bay district
 - -Enhanced Active Case Search and testing, averaging 300 tests daily in the past weeks.
- O Call centre continues operation for 24 hours daily. Today, **1466** calls were answered including **20** alerts.

- A total of 1439 people are currently in quarantine with 103 new admissions in the past 24 hours.
- Since March 2020, 122 people who were in quarantine have tested positive for COVID-19.

- A total of 154 trucks entered the country through various ground crossing points in the last 24 hours.
- o Of these trucks, 56.5% were heading to Erongo, 26.6% to Khomas while 5.8% were heading to Otjozondjupa region.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION

- A high-level delegation team has been sent to Erongo region on 22 July 2020, to engage stakeholders on the impact of COVID-19 in the region.
- O National level continues to support the regions
- Regions have enhanced social mobilization on COVID-19
- Targeted testing in Walvis Bay is ongoing
- Regions have intensified surveillance on travellers from Erongo region for early case detection

CHALLENGES

- Inadequate Human resources in the regions
- Inadequate ICU facilities and ICU equipment in the regions
- Inadequate isolation units, at health facilities in the regions.
- O Inadequate PPE
- Inadequate nasopharyngeal swabs and appropriate transport media.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- The Ministry to fast track the appointment of critical positions for the response in the regions
- Provision of fully equipped ICU facilities in the regions.
- Establish fully equipped isolation units at health facilities in the regions.
- O Logistics pillar to continue with the procurement and distribution of sufficient PPE to the regions to ensure that response is not interrupted.
- NIP to continue sourcing for swabs and appropriate transport media.
