HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (20/07/2020)

- The country is in Stage 4 of the State of Emergency (29 June 2020 -17 September 2020)
- Walvis Bay, Swakopmund, and Arandis Local Authority Areas in Erongo region will remain in Stage 3 (from 07 July 2020 until 23h59 of 03 August 2020).

Nine (9) of the 14 regions have reported confirmed cases; with Erongo reporting the highest 1279 (93.6%) followed by Khomas 40 (2.9%).

- To-date, 15 Health Care Workers have tested positive for COVID-19, with no new confirmation today (20/07/2020).
- Three death cases have been recorded today (20/07/2020), from Erongo region.
- Erongo region recorded 15 recoveries today (20/07/2020).
- Cumulatively, 1305 (95.5%) cases are local transmissions while 61 (4.5%) are imported.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak,
 224 cases were identified during active case search.
- More male cases 754 (55.1%) were recorded compared to female cases 612 (44.8%)

EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION IN NAMIBIA




Figure 2: Distribution of suspected and confirmed COVID-19 cases in Namibia by District, 20 July 2020




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases 20 July 2020

Namibia has recorded 1366 COVID-19 cases since 13 March 2020. Up to 534 (39.1%) of the total cases were recorded during week 29 (Figure 1).

- A high number of cases were recorded in the past three weeks as a result of:
 - -Spread of local transmission in Walvis Bay district
 - -Enhanced Active Case Search and testing, averaging 300 daily in the past weeks.
- Call centre continues operation for 24 hours daily. Today, 1290 calls were answered with 6 alerts.
- The most affected ages are within 20 and 49 years 1054 (77.2%).
- Those aged 60 and above constitute 34 (2.5%) of those affected.




Figure 3: Age and sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 20 July 2020

- Since March 2020, 4725 people have been placed into supervised quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 648 people are currently in quarantine with 8 new admissions in the past 24 hours.
- Since March 2020, 107 people who were in quarantine have tested positive for COVID-19.

Table 3: COVID-19 specimen recorded at NIP & Path care Laboratories 20 July 2020

- To date, 18966 tests have been conducted by NIP & Path-Care laboratories (including 2065 re-tests).
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 3549 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 136 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours.
- Cumulatively, 1254 contacts have completed their 14 days of follow up, while 477 out of 1998 active contacts were monitored today.

- A total of 241 trucks entered the country through various ground crossing points in the last 24 hours.
- Of these trucks, 30.7% were heading to Erongo,
 29.9% to Khomas while
 22.8% were heading to //Kharas region.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION

- National level continues to support the regions
- Regions have enhanced social mobilization on COVID-19
- Targeted testing in Walvis Bay is ongoing
- Regions have intensified surveillance on travellers from Erongo region for early case detection

CHALLENGES

- Inadequate isolation units, at health facilities in the regions.
- O Inadequate PPE
- Inadequate nasopharyngeal swabs and appropriate transport media.
- Prolonged turn-around time of results at NIP.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Establish fully equipped isolation units at health facilities in the regions.
- O Logistics pillar to continue with the procurement and distribution of sufficient PPE to the regions to ensure that response is not interrupted.
- NIP to continue sourcing for swabs and appropriate transport media.
- Enhance laboratory testing capacity throughout the country
