HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (24/07/2020)

- The country is in Stage 4 of the State of Emergency (29 June 2020 -17 September 2020)
- Walvis Bay, Swakopmund, and Arandis Local Authority Areas in Erongo region will remain in Stage 3 (from 07 July 2020 until 23h59 of 03 August 2020).

Eleven (11) of the 14 regions have reported confirmed cases; with Erongo reporting the highest
 1557 (92.3%) followed by Khomas 65 (3.9%).

- Today (24/07/2020), Kunene and Oshikoto regions have recorded their first COVID-19 cases.
- To-date, 23 Health Care Workers have tested positive for COVID-19, with 1 new confirmations today (24/07/2020).
- Cumulatively, 1619 (96.0%) cases are local transmissions while 68 (4.0%) are imported.
- Up to 1020 confirmed cases in Erongo region are still to be placed in isolation facilities.
- More male cases 961 (57.0%) were recorded compared to female cases 726 (43.0%)




Figure 1: Distribution of suspected and confirmed COVID-19 cases in Namibia by District, 24 July 2020

- The most affected ages are within 20 and 49 years 1303 (77.2%).
- Those aged 60 and above constitute 43 (2.5%) of those affected.

- To date, 21778 tests have been conducted by NIP & Path-Care laboratories (including 2269 retests).
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 4274 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 133 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours.
- Cumulatively, 1355 contacts have completed their 14 days of follow up, while 767 out of 2620 active contacts were monitored today.




Figure 2: Age and sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 24 July 2020




Figure 3: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases 24 July 2020

Namibia has recorded 1687 COVID-19 cases since 13 March 2020. Up to 534 (31.7%) of the total cases were recorded during week 29 (Figure 3).

- A high number of cases were recorded in the past three weeks as a result of:
 - -Spread of local transmission in Walvis Bay district
 - -Enhanced Active Case Search and testing, averaging 300 tests daily in the past weeks.
- Call centre continues operation for 24 hours daily. Today, 1185 calls were answered including 6 alerts.

Table 3: Number of people in mandatory quarantine facilities, 24 July 2020

- Since March 2020, 4959
 people have been placed into
 supervised quarantine
 facilities around the country.
- A total of 638 people are currently in quarantine with 14 new admissions in the past 24 hours.
- Since March 2020, 117 people who were in quarantine have tested positive for COVID-19.

- A total of 197 trucks entered the country through various ground crossing points in the last 24 hours.
- Of these trucks, 39.1% were heading to Khomas,
 24.9% to //Kharas while
 18.8% were heading to Erongo region.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION

- A high-level delegation team has been sent to Erongo region on 22 July 2020, to engage stakeholders on the impact of COVID-19 in the region.
- National level continues to support the regions
- Regions have enhanced social mobilization on COVID-19
- Targeted testing in Walvis Bay is ongoing
- Regions have intensified surveillance on travellers from Erongo region for early case detection

CHALLENGES

- Inadequate Human resources in the regions
- Inadequate ICU facilities and ICU equipment in the regions
- Inadequate isolation units, at health facilities in the regions.
- O Inadequate PPE
- Inadequate nasopharyngeal swabs and appropriate transport media.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- The Ministry to fast track the appointment of critical positions for the response in the regions
- Provision of fully equipped ICU facilities in the regions.
- Establish fully equipped isolation units at health facilities in the regions.
- O Logistics pillar to continue with the procurement and distribution of sufficient PPE to the regions to ensure that response is not interrupted.
- NIP to continue sourcing for swabs and appropriate transport media.
