HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (29/08/2020

- The entire country will remain in Stage 3 of the State of Emergency (29 August 2020 12 September 2020).
- A curfew (20h00-05h00) is applicable nationwide as from 29 August 2020 12 September 2020.
- Windhoek, Rehoboth and Okahandja Local Authority Areas are under travel restrictions (29 August 2020 – 12 September 2020)
- The Hosea Kutako International Airport will open as from 01 September 2020.

Cumulatively, 7276 (98.8%) cases are local transmissions while 89 (1.2 %) are imported.

- There is clustered community transmission in Erongo and Khomas regions.
- More male cases 4048 (55.0%) were recorded compared to female cases 3317 (45.0%).
- Workers have COVID-19. (4.1%) Health Care positive for
 - 202 (67.1%) State
 - 98 (32.6%) Private
 - 1 (0.3%) NGO
- Today (29/08/2020), **112** recoveries have been recorded from 3 regions.
- Three (3) fatalities were recorded today from Khomas (2) and //Kharas (1) regions.
- Cumulatively, **64** (**88.9%**) of the fatalities were known to have multiple co-morbidities (Table 3).

- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; with Erongo reporting the highest **3429** (46.6%) followed by Khomas **3139** (42.6%). These two regions are the epicenters for COVID-19.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 2929 (39.8%) have recovered.




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases 29 August 2020

- To date, 57891 tests have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, and UNAM laboratories (including 3639 re-tests).
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 13820 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 252 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 8 regions.
- Cumulatively, 5318 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total 720 (8.7%) of the contacts have tested positive
- Today, **7530** (90.5%) out of **8316** active contacts were monitored.




Figure 2: Age and sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases

Namibia has recorded **7365** COVID-19 cases since 13 March 2020. Up to **2123 (28.8%)** of the total cases were recorded during week 34 (Figure 1).

- A high number of cases were recorded in the past seven weeks as a result of:
 - -Spread of local transmission in the country
 - -Enhanced surveillance including active case search and targeted testing.
- Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily. Today, **1153** calls were answered including **32** alerts.

- The 20-49 years age- brackets constitute **5500** (**74.7%**) of the confirmed cases, followed by a sizable proportion of the 50-59 age group **816** (**11.1%**).
- Among those aged 30-39, a significant proportion of males 1160 (15.8%) are infected more than females 923 (12.5%).
- The under 5 make up 153 (2.1%) of the total cases.
- Aged 60 years and above constitute 313 (4.2%) of the confirmed cases.




Figure 3: Distribution of suspected and confirmed COVID-19 cases in Namibia by District as of 29 August 2020

- Since March 2020, 10119 people have been placed into supervised quarantine facilities around the country.
 - A total of **1715** people are currently in quarantine with **11** new admissions in the past 24 hours.

A total of 273 trucks entered the country through various ground crossing points in the last 24 hours.

- Of these trucks, 100 (36.6%) were heading to Erongo, 78 (28.6%) to Khomas while 57 (20.9%) were heading to //Kharas region.
- The remaining **38 (13.9%)** were heading to the other 8 regions.

- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing

CHALLENGES

- Large data backlog awaiting entry into excel data base and DHIS2.
- Inadequate ICU facilities and ICU equipment at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.
- Inadequate ambulances in the regions.
- Inadequate isolation units, at health facilities in the regions.

Approved

Incident Manager 29 August 2020 RECOMMENDATIONS

- Fast tracking of efforts to use GoData app and DHIS2.
- Provision of fully equipped ICU facilities at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.
- Procurement of ambulances in the regions to ensure prompt response.
- Establish fully equipped isolation units at health facilities in the regions.
