- ➤ The entire country will remain in Stage 3 of the State of Emergency (29 August 2020 - 12 September 2020).
- A curfew (20h00-05h00) is applicable nationwide as from 29 August 2020 12 September 2020.
- Windhoek, Rehoboth and Okahandja Local Authority Areas are under travel restrictions (29 August 2020 12 September 2020)
- A total of **9108** cases have been recorded in a population of approximately 2.5 Million people (UN, Department of Economic and Social Affairs, Population Division: 2019 Revision. www.Worldometers.info)
- Cumulatively, 9013 (99.0%) cases are local transmissions while 95 (1.0 %) are imported.
- More male cases 4915 (54.0%) were recorded compared to female cases 4193 (46.0%).
- To-date, 389 (4.3%) Health Care Workers (HCWs) have tested positive for COVID-19
 - 260 (66.8%) State
 - 128 (32.9%) Private
 - 1 (0.3%) NGO
- Today (08/09/2020), 659 recoveries have been recorded from 7 regions.
- To date, Namibia has recorded 93 deaths.
- Community transmission is ongoing in Khomas and Erongo regions and efforts to prevent widespread transmissions in other regions are ongoing.
- Need for enhanced technical and financial support by partners to control the outbreak; situation is alarming.

- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; with Khomas reporting the highest 4226 (46.4%) followed by Erongo 3638 (40.0%).
- Khomas region is currently the epicenter of the outbreak.
- > Of the total confirmed cases, 4640 (50.9%) have recovered.
- Cumulatively, 79 (84.9%) of the fatalities were known to have multiple co-morbidities (Table 2).

Namibia has recorded 9108 COVID-19 cases since 13 March 2020. Up to 2123 (25.5%) of the total cases were recorded during week 34 (Figure 1).

- A high number of cases were recorded in the past eight weeks as a result of:
 - -Spread of local transmission in the country
 - -Enhanced surveillance including active case search.
- > Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily. Today, 1107 calls were answered including 11 alerts.

- To date, **71924** tests have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, and UNAM laboratories (including **4222** re-tests).
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 18222 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 560 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 10 regions.
- Cumulatively, 8530 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total 1189 (12.4%) of the contacts have tested positive
- Today, 6580 (68.8%) out of 9560 active contacts were monitored.

Table 4: Number of people in mandatory quarantine facilities, 08 September 2020

- Since March 2020, 11768 people have been placed into supervised quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 1340 people are currently in quarantine with 157 new admissions in the past 24 hours.

- The 20-49 years age- brackets constitute **6704** (73.6%) of the confirmed cases, while a sizable proportion of the 50-59 age group **988** (10.8%).
- Among those aged 30-39, a significant proportion of males 1384 (54.9%) are infected more than females 1136 (45.1%).
- The under 5 make up **202** (**2.2%**) of the total cases.
- Aged 60 years and above constitute 345 (3.8%) of the confirmed cases.




Figure 2: Age and sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases

- A total of **294** trucks entered the country through various ground crossing points in the last 24 hours.
- Of these trucks, 116 (39.5%) were heading to Khomas, 88 (29.9%) to //Kharas while 60 (20.4%) were heading to Erongo region.
- The remaining 30 (10.2%) were heading to the other 8 regions.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION

- Expansion of result collection sites around Windhoek is ongoing.
- Recruitment of local volunteers into the response in the districts and regions is ongoing.
- Continuous support to the regions by the national level.
- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing

CHALLENGES

- Large data backlog awaiting entry into excel data base and DHIS2.
- Inadequate ICU facilities and ICU equipment at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.
- Inadequate ambulances in the regions.
- Inadequate isolation units, at health facilities in the regions.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Fast tracking of efforts to use GoData app and DHIS2.
- Provision of fully equipped ICU facilities at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.
- Procurement of ambulances in the regions to ensure prompt response.
- Establish fully equipped isolation units at health facilities in the regions.
