HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (11/10/2020)

- A total of 11989 cases have been recorded in a population of approximately 2.5 Million people, making it about 0.5% of the population infected.
- More male cases 6510 (54.3%) were recorded compared to female cases 5479 (45.7%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 475 (4.0%) Health Care Workers (HCWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
 308 (64.8%) State; 164 (34.5%) Private, 3 (0.6%) NGO
- Today (11/10/2020), 96 recoveries have been recorded from 3 regions region; the recovery rate now stands at 82.7%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 5592 (46.6%) and 3887 (32.4%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 100 (77.5%) are COVID-19 deaths while 29 (22.5%) are COVID-19 related deaths.
- Among the known contacts, 109 (1.4%) new confirmed cases have been reported during the last 7 days.
- In the last 7 days, 316 cases were recorded as compared to a total of 593 cases recorded in the previous week.




Figure 1: Distribution of suspected and confirmed COVID-19 cases by District, 11 October 2020




Figure 2: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, As of 11 October 2020

- Up to 2123 (17.7%) of the total cases were recorded during week 34 (Figure 2).
- After a peak in epi-week 34, the country has seen a gradual reduction in the average number of confirmed cases from 303 to 44 in epi-week 41.
- Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily. Today, 1111 calls were answered including 142 alerts.
- > 810 alerts were received in the last 7 days.

- To date, 109636 tests (including 5838 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM and Namib Poultry laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 28169 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 147 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 9 regions.
- Cumulatively, 20565 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 2852 (37.1%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- > Today, 7601 (98.9%) out of 7685 active contacts were monitored.




Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, As of 11 October 2020

- ➤ The 20-49 years age-brackets constitute **8556** (**71.4%**) of the confirmed cases, while a sizable proportion of the 50-59 age group is **1232** (**10.3%**).
- A total of 1358 (11.3%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- Among those aged 30-39 years, a significant proportion of males, 1815 (55.9%) are infected more than females 1431 (44.1%).
- > The under 5 years make up 296 (2.5%) of the total cases.
- Aged 60 years and above constitute 547 (4.6%) of the confirmed cases.

- Since March 2020, 15781 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 990
 people are currently
 in quarantine with
 42 new admissions
 in the past 24 hours.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION(S)

- Ministry of Health and Social Services continue to receive donations from partners.
- > Training on Integrated Disease Surveillance Response (IDSR) is ongoing country-wide.
- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing.
- > Response strategies for post State of Emergency are underway.
- The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise continuation of essential health services

CHALLENGES

- Lack of isolation units and facilities in the country for special cases in closed settings such as police holding cells and prisons.
- Inadequate ICU facilities and ICU equipment at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities for identified special cases throughout the country.
- Provision of fully equipped ICU facilities at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.




