


- The State of Emergency expiring midnight today will not be extended
- The way forward will be determined after a period of 14 days.
- New directives shall be issued by the Minister of Health as per the Public and Environmental Act as of the 18th September 2020.
- A total of 10207 cases have been recorded in a population of approximately 2.5 Million people, making it about 0.4% of the population infected.
- More male cases 5454 (53.4%) were recorded compared to female cases 4753 (46.6%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 429 (4.2%) Health Care Workers (HCWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
 - 292 (68.1%) State; 136 (31.7%) Private, 1 (0.2%) NGO
- Today (17/09/2020). 175 recoveries have been recorded from 4 regions; the recovery rate now stands at 77.0%.

- To date, 83927 tests (including 4795 re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, and UNAM laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 21730 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 458 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 11 regions.
- Cumulatively, 11653 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 1576 (16.2%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 7522 (76.5%) out of 9834 active contacts were monitored.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases
As of 17 September 2020

- Up to 2123 (20.8%) of the total cases were recorded during week 34 (Figure 1).
- After a peak in epi-week 34, the country has seen a gradual reduction in the mean number of confirmed cases from 303 to 147 in epi-week 37
- Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily. Today, 1405 calls were answered including 2 alerts.

- The 20-49 years age-brackets constitute 7440 (72.9%) of the confirmed cases, while a sizable proportion of the 50-59 age group is 1093 (10.7%).
- Among those aged 30-39 years, a significant proportion of males, 1553 (55.1%) are infected more than females 1268 (44.9 %).
- The under 5 years make up 238 (2.3%) of the total cases.
- Aged 60 years and above constitute 461 (4.5%) of the confirmed cases.

- Since March 2020, 13061 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 12180 people are currently in quarantine with 51 new admissions in the past 24 hours.




Figure 3: Distribution of suspected and confirmed COVID-19 cases in Namibia by District as of 17 September 2020

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTIONS

- Weekly engagements with regions to ensure readiness for effective response.
- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing.
- Efforts on expanding the National testing capacity are ongoing.

CHALLENGES

- Large data backlog awaiting entry into excel data base and DHIS2.
- Inadequate ICU facilities and ICU equipment at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.
- Inadequate isolation units, at health facilities in the regions.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Fast tracking of efforts to use DHIS2 national-wide.
- Provision of fully equipped ICU facilities at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.
- Establish fully equipped isolation units at health facilities in the regions.
