HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (02/10/2020)

TOTAL Tested 101052 Confirmed 11572 Active 2030 Recovered 9419 Death 123

- A total of 11572 cases have been recorded in a population of approximately 2.5 Million people, making it about 0.5% of the population infected.
- More male cases 6294 (54.4%) were recorded compared to female cases 5278 (45.6%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 461 (4.0%) Health Care Workers (HCWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 todate.
 - 302 (65.5%) State; 158 (34.3%) Private, 1 (0.2%)
- Today (02/10/2020), 68 recoveries have been recorded from 5 regions; the recovery rate now stands at 81.4%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 5365 (46.4%) and 3868 (33.4%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 97 (78.9%) are COVID-19 deaths while 26 (21.1%) are COVID-19 related deaths.
- There is an alarming increase in the number of COVID-19 positive cases in closed settings such as schools and police holding cells.

- Up to 2123 (18.3%) of the total cases were recorded during week 34 (Figure 1).
- After a peak in epi-week 34, the country has seen a gradual reduction in the average number of confirmed cases from 303 to 94 in epi-week 39.
- Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily. Today, 1102 calls were answered including 10 alerts.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases
As of 02 October 2020

- To date, 101052 tests (including 5525 re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM and Namib Poultry laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 25010 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 62 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 10 regions.
- Cumulatively, 15472 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 2340 (24.1%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 8506 (87.7%) out of 9703 active contacts were monitored.




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases 02 October 2020

- The 20-49 years age-brackets constitute 8300 (71.7%) of the confirmed cases, while a sizable proportion of the 50-59 age group is 1192 (10.3%).
- A total of 1272 (11.0%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- Among those aged 30-39 years, a significant proportion of males, 1781 (56.2%) are infected more than females 1389 (43.8%).
- The under 5 years make up 288 (2.5%) of the total cases.
- Aged 60 years and above constitute **520** (**4.5%**) of the confirmed cases.

- Training on Integrated Disease Surveillance Response (IDSR) is ongoing country-wide.
- Namib Poultry Laboratory commenced testing for COVID-19 as part of the national strategy to increase testing capacity.
 - o Now there are six laboratories testing for COVID-19.
- Training on Public Health Emergency Operation Centre and Incident Management System with WHO-AFRO is ongoing.

CHALLENGES

- Large data backlog awaiting entry into excel data base and DHIS2.
- Inadequate ICU facilities and ICU equipment at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.

RECOMMENDATIONS


- Fast tracking of efforts to use DHIS2 nationwide.
- Provision of fully equipped ICU facilities at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.


