## **HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (15/10/2020)**

- A total of 12215 cases have been recorded in a population of approximately 2.5 Million people, making it about 0.5% of the population infected.
- More male cases 6668 (54.6%) were recorded compared to female cases 5547 (45.4%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 482 (3.9%) Health Care Workers (HCWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 todate.
  - 311 (64.5%) State; 168 (34.9%) Private, 3 (0.6%) NGO
- Today (15/10/2020), 31 recoveries have been recorded from 4 regions region; the recovery rate now stands at 84.8%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 5655 (46.3%) and 3897 (31.9%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 102 (77.8%) are COVID-19 deaths while 29 (22.1%) are COVID-19 related deaths.
- The cases continue to erupt among closed settings such as schools, police holding cells and prisons.




Figure 2: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, as of 15 October 2020

- Up to 2123 (17.4%) of the total cases were recorded during week 34 (Figure 2).
- After a peak in epi-week 34, the country has seen a gradual reduction in the average number of confirmed cases from 303 to 44 in epi-week 41.
- The National Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily.

Today (15/10/2020), 985 calls were answered including 108 alerts.




Figure 1: Distribution of suspected and confirmed COVID-19 cases by District, 15 October 2020

- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 28895 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 174 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 12 regions.
- Cumulatively, 21581 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 2967 (40.0%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 6234 (84.0%) out of 7417 active contacts were monitored.

- Since March 2020, 17077 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 881 people are currently in quarantine, with 88 new admissions in the last 24 hours.

- The 20-49 years age-brackets constitute 8715 (71.3%) of the confirmed cases, while a sizable proportion of the 50-59 age group is 1243 (10.2%).
- A total of 1406 (11.5) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- Among those aged 30-39 years, a significant proportion of males, 1848 (56.1%) are infected more than females 1446 (44.9%).
- The under 5 years make up 299 (2.4%) of the total cases.
- Aged 60 years and above constitute 552 (4.5%) of the confirmed cases.




Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, As of 15 October 2020

## PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION(S)

- Meeting held by the National Health Emergency Management Committee to review the current public health regulations on COVI-19.
- > Training on Integrated Disease Surveillance Response (IDSR) is ongoing country-wide.
- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing.
- The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise continuation of essential health services

## **CHALLENGES**

- Lack of isolation units and facilities in the country for special cases in closed settings such as police holding cells and prisons.
- Inadequate ICU facilities and ICU equipment at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.

## RECOMMENDATIONS

- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities for identified special cases throughout the country.
- Provision of fully equipped ICU facilities at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.
