# HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (20/10/2020)

- A total of 12406 cases have been recorded in a population of approximately 2.5 Million people, making it about 0.5% of the population infected.
- More male cases 6777 (54.6%) were recorded compared to female cases 5629 (45.4%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 486 (3.9%) Health Care Workers (HCWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date. -314 (64.6%) State; 169 (34.8%) Private, 3 (0.6%) NGO
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 5716 (46.1%) and 3912 (31.5%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 104 (78.2%) are COVID-19 deaths while 29 (21.8%) are COVID-19 related deaths.
- The cases continue to erupt among closed settings such as schools, police holding cells and prisons.

- To date, 117377 tests (including (6058 re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM and Namib Poultry laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 29610 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 267 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 10 regions.
- Cumulatively, 22151 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 3021 (24.4%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 6345 (83.8%) out of 7568 active contacts were monitored.




Figure 1: Distribution of suspected and confirmed COVID-19 cases by District, 20 October 2020

- A total of 233 trucks entered the country through various ground crossing points in the last 24 hours.
- Of these trucks, 98 (42.1%) were heading to Khomas, 69 (29.6%) to //Kharas while 43 (18.5%) were heading to Erongo region.
- > The remaining 23 (9.9%) were heading to the other 8 regions.



Since March 2020, 17731 people have been placed into mandatory

quarantine facilities around the country.

A total of **16586** people are currently in quarantine, with **175** new admissions in the last 24 hours.




Figure 2: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, as of 20 October 2020

- A highest peak of 2123 (17.1%) cases was recorded during week 34 (Figure 2).
- After a peak in epi-week 34, the country has seen a gradual reduction in the average number of confirmed cases to 51 in epi-week 42.
- The National Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily.

Today (20/10/2020), 985 calls were answered including 113 alerts.




Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases. As of 20 October 2020

- Of the total confirmed cases, 8816 (71.1%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- The under 5 years age group make up 302 (2.4%) of the total cases whereas, 561 (4.5%) are above 60 years of age.
- A total of **1470** (**11.8%**) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.

#### PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION(S)

- Training on Case management and IPC for healthcare workers is ongoing with support from the Robert Koch Institute (RKI).
- Training on Integrated Disease Surveillance Response (IDSR) is ongoing country-wide.
- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing.
- The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise continuation of essential health services

#### **CHALLENGES**

- Lack of isolation units and facilities in the country for special cases in closed settings such as police holding cells and prisons.
- Inadequate ICU facilities and ICU equipment at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.

## RECOMMENDATIONS

- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities for identified special cases throughout the country.
- Provision of fully equipped ICU facilities at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.




