HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (22/10/2020)

- A total of 12501 cases have been recorded in a population of approximately 2.5 Million people, making it about 0.5% of the population infected.
- More male cases 6836 (54.7%) were recorded compared to female cases 5665 (45.3%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 514 (4.1%) Health Care Workers (HCWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 todate.
 - -333 (64.8%) State; 178 (34.6%) Private, 3 (0.6%) NGO -280 (54.6%) recoveries including 3 (0.6%) deaths.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 5744 (45.9%) and 3918 (31.3%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 104 (78.2%) are COVID-19 deaths while 29 (21.8%) are COVID-19 related deaths.
- The cases continue to flare up among closed settings such as school premises and hostels, police holding cells, and prisons.
- Today (22/10/2020), 139 recoveries have been recorded from 8 regions; the recovery rate now stands at 86.0%.




Figure 2: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, as of 22 October 2020

- A highest peak of 2123 (17.0%) cases was recorded during week 34 (Figure 2).
- After a peak in epi-week 34, the country has seen a gradual reduction in the average number of confirmed cases to 51 in epi-week 42.
- The National Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily.

Today (22/10/2020), 939 calls were answered including 114 alerts.

Table 3: Number of people in mandatory quarantine facilities, 22 October 2020

- Since March 2020, 17895 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 975 people are currently in quarantine, with 49 new admissions in the last 24 hours.




Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases. As of 22 October 2020

- Of the total confirmed cases, 8877 (71.0%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- The under 5 years age group make up 305 (2.4%) of the total cases whereas, 566 (4.5%) are above 60 years of age.
- A total of 1488 (11.9%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.

- To date, 119493 tests (including (6101 re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM and Namib Poultry laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 30081 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 76 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 11 regions.
- Cumulatively, 22786 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 3038 (24.3%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 6299 (84.0%) out of 7499 active contacts were monitored.




Figure 1: Distribution of suspected and confirmed COVID-19 cases by District, 22 October 2020

- A total of **189** trucks entered the country through various ground crossing points in the last 24 hours.
- Of these trucks, 95 (50.3%) were heading to Khomas, 23 (12.2%) to //Kharas while 19 (10.1%) were heading to Erongo region.
- The remaining 52 (27.4%) were heading to the other 8 regions.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION(S)

- Online orientation held for the GO.DATA training sessions scheduled for 26-29 October 2020
- Announcement of new policy by government on entry requirement for travelers to Namibia.
- > Training on Case management and IPC for healthcare workers is ongoing with support from the Robert Koch Institute (RKI).
- Training on Integrated Disease Surveillance Response (IDSR) is ongoing country-wide.
- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing.
- The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise continuation of essential health services

CHALLENGES

- Lack of isolation units and facilities in the country for special cases in closed settings such as police holding cells, prisons and school hostels.
- Inadequate ICU facilities and ICU equipment at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities for identified special cases throughout the country.
- Provision of fully equipped ICU facilities at referral hospitals and high care units in the districts.
