# HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (07/11/2020)

- A total of 13211 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 0.5% of the population of approximately 2.5 Million people.
- More male cases 7275 (55.1%) were recorded compared to female cases 5936 (44.9%).
- > Of the total confirmed cases, 525 (4.0%) Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
  - -343 (65.3%) State; 179 (34.1%) Private, 3 (0.6%) NGO. -280 (53.3%) recoveries including 3 (0.6%) deaths.
- Today, 3 recoveries have been recorded from Erongo Region; the recovery rate now stands at 87.8%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 5940 (45.0%) and 3967 (30.0%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 105 (78.4%) are COVID-19 deaths while 29 (21.6%) are COVID-19 related deaths.
- The cases continue to flare up among closed settings such as school premises and hostels, police holding cells, and prisons.

## **EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION IN NAMIBIA**




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, as of 07 November 2020

- A highest peak of 2123 (16.1%) cases was recorded during week 34 (Figure 1).
- After a peak in epi-week 34, the country has seen a gradual reduction in the average number of confirmed cases to 47 in epi-week 44.
- The number of cases have plateaued in the last four weeks as seen in the graph.
- The National Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily.

Today (07/11/2020), 895 calls were answered including 58 alerts.

- To date, 132907 tests (including (6439 re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM and Namib Poultry laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 31606 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 6 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 9 regions.
- Cumulatively, 261103 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 3986 (30.2%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 5620 (99.3%) out of 5661 active contacts were monitored.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 9311 (70.5%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 1648 (12.5%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 328 (2.5%) of the total cases whereas, 597 (4.5%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, as of 07 November 2020

- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing.
- The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise continuation of essential health services.

#### CHALLENGES

- Lack of cooperation from some cases and contacts
- Lack of isolation units and facilities in the country for special cases in closed settings such as police holding cells and prisons.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

- Strengthening of awareness measures on the importance of testing.
- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities for identified special cases throughout the country.
