HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (22/11/2020)

- The country has seen a gradual rise in the number of cases; week 48 saw a rise in cases compared to week 45; most of these cases come from Khomas region.
- A total of 13897 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 0.6% of the population.
- More male cases 7617 (54.8%) were recorded compared to female cases 6280 (45.2%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 547 (3.9%) Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
 - 359 (65.6%) State; 185 (33.8%) Private, 3 (0.5%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 452 (82.6%) recoveries and 3 (0.5%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 95.%2.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 6197 (44.6%) and 4029 (29.0%) respectively.
 - Of the total fatalities, 112 (77.2%) are COVID-19 deaths while 33 (22.8%) are COVID-19 related deaths.
 - Among the known contacts, 40 (0.3%) new confirmed cases have been reported during the last 7 days.

EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION IN NAMIBIA




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, As of 22 November 2020

- A highest peak of 2123 (15.3%) cases was recorded during week 34 (Figure 1).
- After a peak in epi-week 34, the country has seen a gradual reduction in the average number of confirmed cases to 51 in epi-week 47.
- The number of cases have plateaued in the last four weeks as seen in the graph.
- The National Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily.

Today (22/11/2020), **787** calls were answered including **68** alerts.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 9728 (70.0%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 1774 (12.8%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 339 (2.4%) of the total cases whereas, 652 (4.7%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, as of 22 November 2020

- To date, 147209 tests (including (6711 re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM and Namib Poultry laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 35242 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 162 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 11 regions.
- Cumulatively, 32520 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 4294 (30.9%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 2866 (100%) out of 2866 active contacts were monitored.

Table 3: Number of people in mandatory quarantine facilities, 22 November 2020

- Since March 2020, 20027 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 507 people are currently in quarantine, with 91 new admissions in the last 24 hours.
