- The cases continue to flare up among the school premises and hostels.
- A total of 14780 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 0.6% of the population.
- More male cases 8048 (54.5%) were recorded compared to female cases 6732 (45.5%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 568 (3.9%) Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
 - 378 (66.5%) State; 187 (32.9%) Private, 3 (0.5%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 530 (93.3%) recoveries and 3 (0.5%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 93.9%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 6684 (45.2%) and 4109 (27.8%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 116 (76.3%) are COVID-19 deaths while 36 (23.7%) are COVID-19 related deaths.




Figure 1: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, as of 03 December 2020

- To date, 160102 tests (including 6961 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM and Namib Poultry laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 37078 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 583 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 12 regions.
- Cumulatively, 34105 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 4320 (29.2%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 3120 (99.9%) out of 3124 active contacts were monitored.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 10255 (69.4%) are in the 20-49 years agebrackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 2001 (13.5%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 352 (2.4%) of the total cases whereas, 691 (4.7%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 2: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, As of 03 December 2020

- A highest peak of 2123 (14.4%) cases was recorded during week 34 (Figure 2).
- The National Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily.

Today (03/12/2020) **855** calls were answered including **71** alerts.

- Since March 2020. 20797 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 557 people are currently quarantine, with 176 new admissions in the last 24 hours.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION(S)

- Expanded Targeted Testing is being conducted at institutions that have confirmed positive cases.
- Virtual training on Integrated Disease Surveillance Response (IDSR) is ongoing country-wide.
- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing.
- > The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

Lack of isolation units and facilities in the country for special cases in closed settings such as schools, police holding cells and prisons.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities for identified special cases throughout the country.
