## HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (06/12/2020)

# **TOTAL** Tested 163861 Active 1115 Recovered 13940 Death 152 **TODAY** Tested 7049 Active 1115 Recovered 10 Death 0

- The cases continue to flare up among the school premises and hostels.
- A total of 15219 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 0.6% of the population.
- More male cases 8262 (54.3%) were recorded compared to female cases 6957 (45.7%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 583 (3.8%) Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 todate.
  - 392 (67.2%) State; 188 (32.2%) Private, 3 (0.5%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
  - 530 (90.9%) recoveries and 3 (0.5%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 91.6%.
- > All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 6897 (45.3%) and 4193 (27.6%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 116 (76.3%) are COVID-19 deaths while 36 (23.7%) are COVID-19 related deaths.

### **EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION IN NAMIBIA**




Figure 1: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, as of 06 December 2020

- To date, 163861 tests (including 7049 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM and Namib Poultry laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 37542 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 291 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 6 regions.
- Cumulatively, 34259 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 4345 (28.5%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 3464 (99.9%) out of 3465 active contacts were monitored.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 10548 (69.3%) are in the 20-49 years agebrackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 2098 (13.8%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 356 (2.3%) of the total cases whereas, 703 (4.6%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 2: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, As of 06 December 2020

- A highest peak of 2123 (13.9%) cases was recorded during week 34 (Figure 2).
- The National Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily.

Today (06/12/2020) 750 calls were answered including 52 alerts.

- Since March 2020, 20969 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 672 people are currently quarantine, with 129 new admissions in the last 24 hours.

# PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION(S)

- Expanded Targeted Testing is being conducted at institutions that have confirmed positive cases.
- Virtual training on Integrated Disease Surveillance Response (IDSR) is ongoing country-wide.
- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing.
- > The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise continuation of essential health services.

#### CHALLENGES

Lack of isolation units and facilities in the country for special cases in closed settings such as schools, police holding cells and prisons.

## RECOMMENDATIONS

Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities for identified special cases throughout the country.
