



- A total of 31253 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 1% of the population.
- More male cases 15805 (51%) were recorded compared to female cases 15448 (49%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1488 (5%) Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
 - 1131 (76%) State; 353 (24%) Private, 4 (0.3%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1238 (83%) recoveries and 6 (0.4%) deaths.
- > The recovery rate now stands at 90%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 13746 (44%) and 6586 (21%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 247 (82%) are COVID-19 deaths while 54 (18%) are COVID-19 related deaths.

As of 19 January 2021

- To date, 243666 tests (including 10956 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry and Central Veterinary laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 57185 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 807 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 14 regions.
- Cumulatively, 50936 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 6852 (22%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 4754 (78%) out of 6112 active contacts monitored.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, as of 19 January 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 21614 (69%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 3629 (12%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make **715 (2%)** of the total cases whereas, **1979 (6%)** are above 60 years of age.
