HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (05/01/2021)



- A total of 26319 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 1.1% of the population.
- ➤ More male cases 13472 (51.2%) were recorded compared to female cases 12847 (48.8%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1217 (4.6%) Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
 - 926 (76.1%) State; 287 (31.0%) Private, 4 (0.3%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 747 (61.4%) recoveries and 4 (0.3%) deaths.
- > The recovery rate now stands at 84.3%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 12343 (46.9%) and 5743 (21.8%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 188 (80%) are COVID-19 deaths while 47 (20%) are COVID-19 related deaths.




Figure 1: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, as of 05 January 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 18373 (69.8%) are in the 20-49 years agebrackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 3085 (11.7%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make 578 (2.2%) of the total cases whereas, 1539 (5.8%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 2: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, As of 05 January 2021

- A highest peak of 3463 (13.2%) cases was recorded during week 53 (Figure 2).
- The National Call center continues operation for 24 hours daily.

Today (05/01/2021) 1073 calls were answered including 111 alerts.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION(S)

- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing.
- The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise continuation of essential health services.

- To date, 216782 tests (including 9326 re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry and Central Veterinary laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 49850 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 596 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 12 regions.
- Cumulatively, 43685 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 5802 (22.%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 4483 (76.8%) out of 5911 active contacts monitored.

CHALLENGES

- Lack of isolation units and facilities in the regions.
- Non-adherence to COVID-19 prevention measures by the general public.
