HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (24/01/2021)

- A total of **32650** cases have been recorded to-date, representing **1%** of the population.
- More male cases 16444 (50%) were recorded compared to female cases 16206 (50%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1552 (5%) Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
 - 1184 (76%) State; 364 (23%) Private, 4 (0.3%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1238 (80%) recoveries and 6 (0.4%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 93%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 14035 (43%) and 6756 (21%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 262 (82%) are COVID-19 deaths while 57 (18%) are COVID-19 related deaths.



A highest peak of **3485 (11%)** cases was recorded during week 54 (Figure 1).

To date, 253218 tests (including 11119 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry and

Central Veterinary laboratories.

- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 58645 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 252 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 12 regions.
- Cumulatively, 52713 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 7204 (22%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 4012 (69%) out of 5788 active contacts monitored.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, as of 24 January 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 22460 (69%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 3886 (12%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make 762 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2089 (6%) are above 60 years of age.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION(S)

- Public awareness on COVID-19 prevention measures is ongoing.
- > The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

- Lack of isolation units and facilities in the regions.
- Non-adherence to COVID-19 prevention measures by the general public.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities throughout the country.
- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID -19 prevention measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
