## **HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (25/01/2021)**



- A total of 32957 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 1% of the population.
- More male cases 16600 (50%) were recorded compared to female cases 16357 (50%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1565 (5%) Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
  - 1195 (76%) State; 366 (23%) Private, 4 (0.3%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
  - 1238 (79%) recoveries and 6 (0.4%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 92%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 14090 (43%) and 6781 (21%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 269 (82%) are COVID-19 deaths while 59 (18%) are COVID-19 related deaths.



- To date, 255076 tests (including 11132 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry and Central Veterinary laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 59792 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 1147 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 10 regions.
- Cumulatively, 53970 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 7456 (23%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 3929 (69%) out of 5705 active contacts monitored.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 22657 (69%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 3946 (12%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make 770 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2104 (6%) are above 60 years of age.





- Since March 2020, 30434 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 1434 people are currently in quarantine, with 148 new admissions.

- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID -19 prevention measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
