HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (28/01/2021)



- A total of **33696** cases have been recorded to-date, representing **1%** of the population.
- More male cases 17006 (50%) were recorded compared to female cases 16690 (50%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1606 (5%) Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 todate.
 - 1232 (77%) State; 370 (23%) Private, 4
 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1463 (91%) recoveries and 6 (0.4%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 94%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 14260 (42%) and 6867 (20%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 280 (82%) are COVID-19 deaths while 62 (18%) are COVID-19 related deaths.



- To date, 260458 tests (including 11224 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry and Central Veterinary laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 61003 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 604 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 14 regions.
- Cumulatively, 55581 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 7618 (23%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 3951 (77%) out of 5155 active contacts monitored.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 23146 (69%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 4040 (12%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make 785 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2158 (6%) are above 60 years of age.






Figure 1: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, as of 28 January 2021

A highest peak of 3485 (10%) cases was recorded during week 54 (Figure 2).

The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.

Today (28/01/2021), 638 calls were answered including 88 alerts.

- Since March 2020, 31082 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 1257 people are currently in quarantine, with 170 new admissions.
