- A total of 36366 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 1% of the population.
- More male cases 18422 (51%) were recorded compared to female cases 17944 (49%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1686 (5%) Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 to-date.
  - 1297 (77%) State; 381 (23%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
  - 1648 (98%) recoveries and 6 (0.4%) deaths.

- The recovery rate now stands at 94%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 14828 (41%) and 7217 (20%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 313 (80%) are COVID-19 deaths while 79 (20%) are COVID-19 related deaths.



To date, **282371** tests (including **11437** retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry and Central Veterinary laboratories.

- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 66263 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 666 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 13 regions.
- Cumulatively, 61442 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 8588 (24%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 2122 (47%) out of 4516 active contacts monitored.

Age group

- Of the total confirmed cases, 24633 (68%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 4751 (13%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make 841 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2332 (6%) are above 60 years of age.
