HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (26/02/2021)

- A total of 38642 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 2% of the population.
- More male cases 19615 (51%) were recorded compared to female cases 19027 (49%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1749 (5%) Health Workers (HWs) have tested positive for COVID-19 todate.
 - 1354 (77%) State; 391 (22%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1686 (96%) recoveries and 6 (0.3%) deaths.
- > The recovery rate now stands at 94%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 15205 (39%) and 7427 (19%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 332 (79%) are COVID-19 deaths while 88 (21%) are COVID-19 related deaths.



A highest peak of 3485 (9%) cases was recorded during week 53 (Figure 1).

The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.

Today (26/02/2021), 597 calls were answered including 71 alerts.




Figure 2: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, As of 26 February 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 25621 (66%) are in the 20-49 years agebrackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 5702 (15%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make 880 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2420 (6%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, as of 26 February 2021

- To date, 298411 tests (including 11528 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry and Central Veterinary laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 70111 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 500 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 9 regions.
- Cumulatively, 65633 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 9457 (24%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 1909 (48%) out of 4011 active contacts monitored.

Table 3: Number of people in mandatory quarantine facilities, 26 February 2021

- Since March 2020, 35909 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 2121 people are currently in quarantine, with 234 new admissions.
