

- A total of 39033 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 2% of the population.
- More male cases 19786 (51%) were recorded compared to female cases 19248 (49%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1760 (5%) are Health Workers (HWs).
 - 1365 (77%) State; 391 (22%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1686 (96%) recoveries and 6 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 93%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 15259 (39%) and 7467 (19%) respectively.
- > Of the total fatalities, 338 (79%) are COVID-19 deaths while 90 (21%) are COVID-19 related deaths.

A highest peak of 3485 (9%) cases was recorded during week 1 in 2021 (Figure 1).

The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.

Today (28/02/2021), 586 calls were answered including 65 alerts.




Figure 2: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 28 February 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 25783 (66%) are in the 20-49 years agebrackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 5876 (15%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- > The under 5 years age group make up 886 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2443 (6%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, 28 February 2021

- To date, 301354 tests (including 11540 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry and Central Veterinary laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 70149 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 13 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 11 regions.
- Cumulatively, 65719 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 9479 (24%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- > Today, 1857 (47%) out of 3963 active contacts monitored.

Table 3: Number of people in mandatory quarantine facilities, 28 February 2021

- Since March 2020. 35925 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 1956 people are currently in quarantine, with 0 new admissions.
