HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (11/03/2021)

TOTAL Tested 316536 Confirmed 40810 Active 2129 Recovered 38217 Death 456



- A total of 40810 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 2% of the population.
- More male cases 20650 (51%) were recorded compared to female cases 20160 (49%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1834 (4%) are Health Workers (HWs).
 - 1433 (78%) State; 397 (22%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1749 (95%) recoveries and 6 (0.3%) deaths.
- > The recovery rate now stands at 94%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 15662 (38%) and 7581 (19%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 362 (79%) are COVID-19 deaths while 94 (21%) are COVID-19 related deaths.




Figure 1: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases


- Of the total confirmed cases, 26634 (65%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 6486 (16%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
 - The under 5 years age group make up 921 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2561 (6%) are above 60 years of age.

A	To date, 316536 tests (including 11637 re-
	tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-
	Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry,
	Diagno, NAMPath and Central Veterinary
	laboratories.

- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 73913 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 256 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 13 regions.
- Cumulatively, 69869 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 10221 (25%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 2832 (74%) out of 3816 active contacts monitored.

The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.

Today (11/03/2021), 603 calls were answered including 22 alerts.

A highest peak of 3485 (9%) cases was recorded during week 1 in 2021 (Figure 2).

admissions.




Figure 3: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 11 March 2021
