HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (06/03/2021)




- A total of 40030 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 2% of the population.
- More male cases 20280 (51%) were recorded compared to female cases 19750 (49%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1797 (4%) are Health Workers (HWs).
 - 1401 (78%) State; 392 (22%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1686 (94%) recoveries and 6 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 94%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 15493 (39%) and 7530 (19%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 348 (79%) are COVID-19 deaths while 90 (21%) are COVID-19 related deaths.

EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION IN NAMIBIA



- Of the total confirmed cases, 26262 (66%) are in the 20-49 years agebrackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 6219 (15%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 906 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2512 (6%) are above 60 years of age.


Figure 1: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, 06 March 2021

- To date, 309108 tests (including 11602 re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry, Diagno, NAMPath and Central Veterinary laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 71988 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 125 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 8 regions.
- Cumulatively, 67239 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 9813 (25%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 114 (3%) out of 4301 active contacts monitored.

Today (06/03/2021), 579 calls were answered including 81 alerts.




Figure 3: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 06 March 2021
