

HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (03/03/2021)




- A total of 39466 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 2% of the population.
- More male cases 20010 (51%) were recorded compared to female cases 19456 (49%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1769 (4%) are Health Workers (HWs).
 - 1373 (78%) State; 392 (22%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1686 (95%) recoveries and 6 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 94%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 15375 (39%) and 7488 (19%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 346 (79%) are COVID-19 deaths while 90 (21%) are COVID-19 related deaths.

EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION IN NAMIBIA



- Of the total confirmed cases, 26008 (66%) are in the 20-49 years agebrackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 6018 (15%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
 - The under 5 years age group make up 895 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2461 (6%) are above 60 years of age.

Figure 1: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, 03 March 2021

- To date, 304922 tests (including 11567 re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry, Diagno and Central Veterinary laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 70684 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 60 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 8 regions.
- Cumulatively, 66608 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 9623 (24%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 589 (16%) out of 3637 active contacts monitored.




Figure 2: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 03 March 2021

A highest peak of 3485 (9%) cases was recorded during week 1 in 2021 (Figure 2).

The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.

Today (03/03/2021), 543 calls were answered including 26 alerts.




Figure 3: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 03 March 2021
