HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (31/03/2021)



- A total of 44374 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 2% of the population.
- More male cases 22339 (50%) were recorded compared to female cases 22035 (50%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1961 (4%) are Health Workers (HWs).
 - 1543 (79%) State; 414 (21%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1810 (92%) recoveries and 6 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 94%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 16348 (37%) and 7999 (18%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 427 (81%) are COVID-19 deaths while 101 (19%) are COVID-19 related deaths.

Table 2: COVID-19 specimen recorded at the Laboratories, 31 March 2021

- To date, 345923 tests (including 11770 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry, Diagno, NAMPath, Namibia Central Pathology and Central Veterinary laboratories
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 80602 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 270 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 12 regions.
- Cumulatively, 75948 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 11297 (26%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 2635 (62%) out of 4227 active contacts monitored.




Figure 1: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 31 March 2021




Figure 2: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 31 March 2021

- A highest peak of 3485 (8%) cases was recorded during week 1 in 2021 (Figure 2).
- The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- Today (31/03/2021), 546 calls were answered including 20 alerts.

- Since March 2020, 41435 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 1450 people are currently in quarantine, with
 93 new admissions.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 28421 (64%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of **7501** (17%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 1010 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2835 (6%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 31 March 2021

- Lack of isolation units and facilities for cases detected in boarding schools.
- Non-adherence to COVID-19 prevention measures by the general public.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities for cases in schools.
- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID -19 prevention measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
