- A total of 47172 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 2% of the population.
- Cases are equally distributed by gender at 50%.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 2031 (4%) are Health Workers.
  - 1601 (79%) State; 426 (21%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
  - 2005 (99%) recoveries and 6 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 96%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 16894 (36%) and 8454 (18%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 501 (81%) are COVID-19 deaths while 115 (19%) are COVID-19 related deaths.



- Since March 2020, 44273 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 1337 people are currently in quarantine, with 314 new admissions.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 29833 (63%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 8253 (17%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 1079 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 3070 (6%) are above 60 years of age.

- To date, 372831 tests (including 11890 re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry, Diagno, NAMPath, Namibia Central Pathology and Central Veterinary laboratories
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 86282 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 267 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 13 regions.
- Cumulatively, 81908 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 11775 (25%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 2597 (73%) out of 3556 active contacts monitored.






Figure 2: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 21 April 2021

- The highest peaks of 3463 (7%) and 3485 (7%) cases were recorded during week 53 of 2020 and 1 of 2021 respectively (Figure 2).
- The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- Today (21/04/2021), 396 calls were answered including 26 alerts.

- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities for cases detected in schools and police holding cells.
- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID -19 prevention measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
