HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (30/03/2021)

TODAY

Confirmed 88
Active 1758

- A total of 44139 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 2% of the population.
- More male cases 22237 (50%) were recorded compared to female cases 21902 (50%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1956 (4%) are Health Workers (HWs).
 - 1538 (79%) State; 414 (21%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1810 (93%) recoveries and 6 (0.3%) deaths.
- > The recovery rate now stands at 95%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 16312 (37%) and 7965 (18%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 423 (81%) are COVID-19 deaths while 100 (19%) are COVID-19 related deaths.



Table 2: COVID-19 specimen recorded at the Laboratories, 30 March 2021

- To date, 344004 tests (including 1384 re-tests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry, Diagno, NAMPath, Namibia Central Pathology and Central Veterinary laboratories
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 80332 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 634 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 13 regions.
- Cumulatively, 75541 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 11273 (26%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 2766 (67%) out of 4154 active contacts monitored.




Figure 1: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 30 March 2021




Figure 2: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 30 March 2021

- A highest peak of 3485 (8%) cases was recorded during week 1 in 2021 (Figure 2).
- The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- Today (30/03/2021), 530 calls were answered including 14 alerts.

- Since March 2020, 41342 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 1648
 people are currently
 in quarantine, with
 269 new admissions.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 28311 (64%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of **7418** (17%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 1006 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2817 (6%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 30 March 2021

- Honourable Minister of Health and Social Services launched a national COVID-19 vaccination programme in Windhoek.
- The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise the continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

- Lack of isolation units and facilities for cases detected in boarding schools.
- Non-adherence to COVID-19 prevention measures by the general public.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities for cases in schools.
- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID -19 prevention measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
