- A total of 44683 cases have been recorded todate, representing 2% of the population.
- More male cases 22476 (50%) were recorded compared to female cases 22207 (50%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1970 (4%) are Health Workers.
 - 1548 (79%) State; 418 (21%) Private, 4
 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1810 (92%) recoveries and 6 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 95%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 16381 (37%) and 8048 (18%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 432 (81%) are COVID-19 deaths while 101 (19%) are COVID-19 related deaths.

Table 2: COVID-19 specimen recorded at the Laboratories, 02 April 2021

- To date, 347858 tests (including 11781 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry, Diagno, NAMPath, Namibia Central Pathology and Central Veterinary laboratories
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 80994 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 220 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 7 regions.
- Cumulatively, 76347 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 11373 (25%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 847 (20%) out of 4177 active contacts monitored.




Figure 1: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 02 April 2021




Figure 2: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 02 April 2021

A highest peak of 3485 (8%) cases was recorded during week 1 in 2021 (Figure 2).

- Since March 2020, 41683 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 1388 people are currently in quarantine, with 184 new admissions.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 28569 (64%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of **7593 (17%)** of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 1023 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2946 (6%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases

- Non-adherence to COVID-19 prevention measures by the general public.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities for cases in schools.
- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID -19 prevention measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
