HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (10/04/2021)



- A total of 45527 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 2% of the population.
- Cases are equally distributed by gender at 50%.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1987 (4%) are Health Workers.
 - 1564 (79%) State; 419 (21%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1941 (98%) recoveries and 6 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 96%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 16544 (36%) and 8197 (18%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 465 (82%) are COVID-19 deaths while 105 (18%) are COVID-19 related deaths.




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 10 April 2021

A highest peak of 3485 (8%) cases was recorded during week 1 in 2021 (Figure 1).




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 10 April 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 28981 (64%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of **7828** (17%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 1045 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2910 (6%) are above 60 years of age.

Cumulative_confirmed cases per 100 000 people




Figure 3: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 10 April 2021

- To date, 358195 tests (including 11826 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry, Diagno, NAMPath, Namibia Central Pathology and Central Veterinary laboratories
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 83568 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 64 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 14 regions.
- Cumulatively, 78686 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 11638 (26%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 1653 (41%) out of 4022 active contacts monitored.

- Since March 2020, 42634 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 1436 people are currently in quarantine, with 65 new admissions.

- Lack of isolation units and facilities for cases detected in boarding schools and police holding cells.
- Non-adherence to COVID-19 prevention measures by the general public.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities for cases detected in schools and police holding cells.
- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID -19 prevention measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
