HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (11/04/2021)

- A total of 45787 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 2% of the population.
- Cases are equally distributed by gender at 50%.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 1992 (4%) are Health Workers.
 - 1568 (79%) State; 420 (21%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1941 (97%) recoveries and 6 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 95%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 16554 (36%) and 8215 (18%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 469 (81%) are COVID-19 deaths while 106 (19%) are COVID-19 related deaths.

EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION IN NAMIBIA




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 11 April 2021

- A highest peak of 3485 (8%) cases was recorded during week 1 in 2021 (Figure 1).
- The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- Today (11/04/2021), **576** calls were answered including **13** alerts.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 11 April 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 29078 (64%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of **7952** (**17%**) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 1048 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2930 (6%) are above 60 years of age.

Cumulative_confirmed cases per 100 000 people




Figure 3: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 11 April 2021

- To date, 360173 tests (including 11829 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry, Diagno, NAMPath, Namibia Central Pathology and Central Veterinary laboratories
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 83604 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 36 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 14 regions.
- Cumulatively, 78763 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 11638 (26%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 2709 (67%) out of 4023 active contacts monitored.

- Since March 2020, 42664 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 1433 people are currently in quarantine, with 30 new admissions.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION (S)

The government and developmental partners continue to prioritise the continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

- Lack of isolation units and facilities for cases detected in boarding schools and police holding cells.
- Non-adherence to COVID-19 prevention measures by the general public.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities for cases detected in schools and police holding cells.
- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID -19 prevention measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
