HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (14/04/2021)

- Cases are equally distributed by gender at 50%.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 2000 (4%) are Health Workers.
 - 1574 (79%) State; 422 (21%) Private, 4 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 1941 (97%) recoveries and 6 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 96%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 16650 (36%) and 8279 (18%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 484 (81%) are COVID-19 deaths while 112 (19%) are COVID-19 related deaths.




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 14 April 2021

- The highest peaks of 3463 (7%) and 3485 (8%) cases were recorded during week 53 of 2020 and 1 of 2021 respectively (Figure 1).
- The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- Today (14/04/2021), 556 calls were answered including 31 alerts.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 14 April 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 29293 (63%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 8053 (17%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 1053 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 2969 (2%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 3: Distribution of cumulative confirmed cases per 100 000 by region, 14 April 2021

- To date, 364191 tests (including 11851 retests) have been conducted by NIP, Path-Care, NAMDEB, UNAM, Namib Poultry, Diagno, NAMPath, Namibia Central Pathology and Central Veterinary laboratories
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 84729 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 668 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 10 regions.
- Cumulatively, 79759 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while a total of 11699 (25%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 3012 (73%) out of 4152 active contacts monitored.

- Since March 2020, 43286 people have been placed into mandatory quarantine facilities around the country.
- A total of 1575 people are currently in quarantine, with 204 new admissions.

The government and developmental partners continue to prioritize the continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

- Lack of isolation units and facilities for cases detected in boarding schools and police holding cells.
- Non-adherence to COVID-19 prevention measures by the general public.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Establish fully equipped isolation units and facilities for cases detected in schools and police holding cells.
- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID -19 prevention measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
