
- A total of 120 221 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 5% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 63 624 (53%) have been recorded compared to male cases 56 597 (47%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 4 042 (3%) are Health Workers.
 - 3 379 (84%) State; 655 (16%) Private, 8 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 3 769 (93%) recoveries and 13 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 81%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 40 883 (34%) and 17 604 (15%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 2 870 (91%) are COVID-19 deaths while 272 (9%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2.6%.

- ➤ The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- Today (03/08/2021), **412** calls were answered including **5** alerts.

- Since March 2020, 69 564 people have been placed into quarantine around the country.
- A total of 2 954 people are currently in quarantine, with 115 new admissions.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 72 483 (60%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 19 030 (16%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 2 613 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 11 746 (10%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 03 August 2021

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of fourteen (14) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP, Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre, ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory and Medlink Laboratory Services.
- To date, 620 604 tests (including 13 842 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 132 024 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 223 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 12 regions.
- Cumulatively, 128 048 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 141 contacts are lost to followup and a total of 23 330 (19%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
 - Today, 1 046 (38%) out of 2 783 active contacts were monitored.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION (S)

- > Public Health measures continues to be enforced as the situation is closely monitored.
- The COVID-19 vaccination programme is ongoing throughout the country
- The government and development partners continue to prioritize the continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

Poor adherence to COVID-19 Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) measures by the general public.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID-19 IPC measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.


