
- A total of 117 293 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 5% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 62 017 (53%) have been recorded compared to male cases 55 276 (47%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 3 965 (3%) are Health Workers.
 - 3 306 (83%) State; 651 (16%) Private, 8 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 3 769 (95) recoveries and 13 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 80%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 40 541 (35%) and 17 266 (15%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 2 624 (91%) are COVID-19 deaths while 247 (9%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2.4%.

- The highest peak of 12 787 (11%) cases was recorded during week 25 of 2021 (Figure 1).
- > The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- > Today (25/07/2021), 468 calls were answered including 9 alerts.

- Since March 2020, 68 072 people have been placed into quarantine around the country.
- A total of 3 738 people are currently in quarantine, with 346 new admissions.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 70 936 (60%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 18 671 (16%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 2 506 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 11 196 (10%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 25 July 2021

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of fourteen (14) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP (including Oshakati), Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre, ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory and Medlink Laboratory Services.
- To date, 601 580 tests (including 13 727 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 128 215 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 205 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 12 regions.
- Cumulatively, 122 001 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 140 contacts are lost to followup and a total of 21 654 (18%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 1 893 (38%) out of 4 947 active contacts were monitored.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION (S)

- The COVID-19 vaccination programme is ongoing throughout the country
- The government and development partners continue to prioritize the continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

Poor adherence to COVID-19 Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) measures by the general public.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID-19 IPC measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
