- A total of 118 429 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 5% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 62 642 (53%) have been recorded compared to male cases 55 787 (47%).
- Of the total confirmed cases, 4 009 (3%) are Health Workers.
 - 3 348 (84%) State; 653 (16%) Private, 8 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 3 769 (94%) recoveries and 13 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 80%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 40 680 (34%) and 17 395 (15%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 2 736 (91%) are COVID-19 deaths while 263 (9%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2.5%.

- Since March 2020, 68 822 people have been placed into quarantine around the country.
- A total of 3 400 people are currently in quarantine, with 200 new admissions.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 71 534 (60%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of **18 783 (16%)** of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- The under 5 years age group make up 2 540 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 11 443 (10%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 28 July 2021



- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of fourteen (14) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP (including Oshakati), Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre, ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory and Medlink Laboratory Services.
- To date, 609 184 tests (including 13 782 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 129 819 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 545 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 12 regions.
- Cumulatively, 125 168 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 140 contacts are lost to followup and a total of 22 107 (19%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 686 (21%) out of 3331 active contacts were monitored.

- Today (28/07/2021), **580** calls were answered including **10** alerts.
