
- A total of 122 907 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 5% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 64 684 (53%) have been recorded.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 4 200 (3%) are Health Workers.
 - 3 485 (83%) State; 707 (17%) Private, 8 (0.2%)
 Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 4 024 (96%) recoveries and 13 (0.3%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 90%.
- All fourteen (14) regions have reported confirmed cases; Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest with 41 097 (34%) and 17 830 (15%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 2 984 (91%) are COVID-19 deaths while 278 (9%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2.7%.

- Since March 2020, 70 384 people have been placed into quarantine around the country.
- A total of 1 658 people are currently in quarantine, with 4 new admissions.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 73 393 (60%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 19 342 (16%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- A total of 14 624 (12%) of the confirmed cases are among the 50 59 years group.
- The under 5 years age group make up 2 678 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 12 060 (10%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of fourteen (14) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP, Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre, ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory, MAXI and Medlink Laboratory Services.
- To date, 633 588 tests (including 13 978 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 133 621 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 214 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 12 regions.
- Cumulatively, 130 331 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 147 contacts are lost to followup and a total of 23 630 (19%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 1 151 (64%) out of 1 807 active contacts were monitored.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION (S)

- > Public Health measures continues to be enforced as the situation is closely monitored.
- > The COVID-19 vaccination programme is ongoing throughout the country
- > The government and development partners continue to prioritize the continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

Poor adherence to COVID-19 Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) measures by the general public.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID-19 IPC measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
