
- A total of 123 242 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 5% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 65 321 (53%) have been recorded.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 4 222 (3%) are Health Workers.
 - 3 507 (83%) State; 707 (17%) Private, 8 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 4 157 (98%) recoveries and 25 (0.6%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 95%.
- Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest number of cases with 41 194 (33%) and 17 978 (15%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 3 047 (92%) are COVID-19 deaths while 278 (8%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2.5%.

The highest peak of 12 787 (10%) cases was recorded during week 25 of 2021 (Figure 1).

- After a peak in epi-week 25, the country has seen a gradual reduction in the average number of confirmed cases to 170 in epi-week 32.
- The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- Today (18/08/2021), 500 calls were answered including 9 alerts.

- Since March 2020, 71 819 people have been placed into quarantine around the country.
- A total of 1 702 people are currently in quarantine, with 83 new admissions.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 73 953 (60%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 19 596 (16%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- A total of 14 743 (12%) of the confirmed cases are among the 50 - 59 years group.
- The under 5 years age group make up 2 727 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 12 223 (10%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 18 August 2021

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of fifteen (15) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP, Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre, ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory, MAXI and Medlink Laboratory Services.
- To date, 643 645 tests (including 14 039 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 135 763 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 326 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 13 regions.
- Cumulatively, 132 357 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 147 contacts are lost to followup and a total of 24 024 (19%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 853 (45%) out of 1 902 active contacts were monitored.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACTION (S)

- Public Health measures continues to be enforced as the situation is closely monitored.
- The COVID-19 vaccination programme is ongoing throughout the country
- The government and development partners continue to prioritize the continuation of essential health services.

CHALLENGES

Poor adherence to COVID-19 Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) measures by the general public.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID-19 IPC measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
