

- A total of 124 618 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 5% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 66 106 (53%) have been recorded.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 4 257 (3%) are Health Workers.
 - 3 540 (83%) State; 709 (17%) Private, 8 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 4 157 (98%) recoveries and 25 (0.6%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 95%.
- Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest number of cases with 41 319 (33%) and 18 100 (15%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 3 092 (92%) are COVID-19 deaths while 278 (8%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2.7%.

The highest peak of 12 787 (10%) cases was recorded during week 25 of 2021 (Figure 1).

- The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- Today (26/08/2021), 490 calls were answered including 8 alerts.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 74 457 (60%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 20 152 (16%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- ➤ A total of 14 857 (12%) of the confirmed cases are among the 50 59 years group.
- The under 5 years age group make up 2 781 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 12 371 (10%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 26 August 2021

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of fifteen (15) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP, Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre, ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory, MAXI and Medlink Laboratory Services.
- To date, 656 106 tests (including 14 116 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 138 273 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 609 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 12 regions.
- Cumulatively, 134 731 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 180 contacts are lost to followup and a total of 24 466 (20%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 1 160 (55%) out of 2 109 active contacts were monitored.

Table 4: Number of people in quarantine, 26 August 2021

- Since March 2020, 74 349 people have been placed into quarantine around the country.
- A total of 1 963 people are currently in quarantine, with 1 774 admissions.
- *Kindly note: Not all admissions and discharges were done in 24 hours. There was a delay in reporting from the regions.
