

- A total of 125 313 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 5% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 66 529 (53%) have been recorded.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 4 271 (3%) are Health Workers.
 - 3 554 (83%) State; 709 (17%) Private, 8 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 4 233 (99%) recoveries and 25 (0.6%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 96%.
- Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest number of cases with 41 375 (33%) and 18 141 (15%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 3 120 (92%) are COVID-19 deaths while 279 (8%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2.7%.

EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION IN NAMIBIA



The highest peak of 12 787 (10%) cases was recorded during week 25 of 2021 (Figure 1).

- The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- Today (01/09/2021), 413 calls were answered including 5 alerts.

- Of the total confirmed cases, 74 732 (60%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 20 397 (16%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- A total of 14 919 (12%) of the confirmed cases are among the 50 59 years group.
- The under 5 years age group make up 2 799 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 12 466 (10%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 01 September 2021

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of fifteen (15) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP, Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre, ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory, MAXI and Medlink Laboratory Services.
- To date, 664 093 tests (including 14 139 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 139 557 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 206 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 11 regions.
- Cumulatively, 136 533 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 288 contacts are lost to followup and a total of 24 648 (20%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 1 035 (66%) out of 1 576 active contacts were monitored.

Table 4: Number of people in quarantine, 01 September 2021

- Since March 2020, 75 276 people have been placed into quarantine around the country.
- A total of 1 731 people are currently in quarantine, with 273 admissions.
