- A total of 126 203 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 5% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 66 965 (53%) have been recorded.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 4 293 (3%) are Health Workers, with 4 new confirmations today.
 - 3 574 (83%) State; 711 (17%) Private, 8 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 4 265 (99%) recoveries and 25 (0.6%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 96%.
- Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest number of cases with 41 443 (33%) and 18 188 (14%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 3 147 (92%) are COVID-19 deaths while 284 (8%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2.7%.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 09 September 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 75 063 (60%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 20 738 (16%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- A total of 14 987 (12%) of the confirmed cases are among the 50 - 59 years group.
- The under 5 years age group make up 2 837 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 12 578 (10%) are above 60 years of age.



- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of fifteen (15) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP, Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, DesJo Medical Test Centre, ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory, MAXI and Medlink Laboratory Services.
- To date, 675 886 tests (including 14 179 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 141 060 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 116 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 12 regions.
- Cumulatively, 138 079 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 288 contacts are lost to follow-up and a total of 24 885 (20%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 433 (28%) out of 1 558 active contacts were monitored.

- Today (09/09/2021), 476 calls were answered.
