- A total of 126 708 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 5% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 67 370 (53%) have been recorded.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 4 310 (3%) are Health Workers, with 2 new confirmations today.
 - 3 591 (83%) State; 711 (16%) Private, 8 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 4 265 (99%) recoveries and 25 (0.6%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 96%.
- Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest number of cases with 41 495 (33%) and 18 212 (14%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 3 181 (92%) are COVID-19 deaths while 285 (8%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2.7%.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 16 September 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 75 292 (59%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 20 865 (16%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- A total of 15 034 (12%) of the confirmed cases are among the 50 - 59 years group.
- The under 5 years age group make up 2 850 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 12 667 (10%) are above 60 years of age.



- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of fifteen (15) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP, Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre, ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory, MAXI and Medlink Laboratory Services.
- To date, 686 029 tests (including 14 207 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 142 201 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 235 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 13 regions.
- Cumulatively, 139 529 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 288 contacts are lost to follow-up and a total of 25 070 (20%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 761 (69%) out of 1 096 active contacts were monitored.

- The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- Today (16/09/2021), 594 calls were answered.

- Slow vaccine uptake among members of the public, and circulation of anti-vaccination information.
- Poor adherence to COVID-19 Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) measures by the general public.

- Encourage the public to get vaccinated and strengthen community health awareness to encounter antivaccination information in circulation.
- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID-19 IPC measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
