- A total of 127 182 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 5% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 67 653 (53%) have been recorded.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 4 319 (3%) are Health Workers, with no new confirmations today.
 - 3 600 (83%) State; 711 (16%) Private, 8 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 4 265 (99%) recoveries and 25 (0.6%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 96%.
- Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest number of cases with 41 537 (33%) and 18 238 (14%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 3 203 (92%) are COVID-19 deaths while 287 (8%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2.7%.



- The highest peak of 12 787 (10%) cases was recorded during week 25 of 2021 (Figure 1).
- After a peak in epi-week 25, the country has seen a gradual reduction in the average number of confirmed cases from 1 598 to 81 in epi-week 37.
- The number of cases have plateaued in the last four weeks as seen in the graph.
- The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- Today (22/09/2021), 797 calls were answered.

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of fifteen (15) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP, Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre, ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory, MAXI and Medlink Laboratory Services.
- To date, 693 832 tests (including 14 233 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 142 980 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 266 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 14 regions.
- Cumulatively, 140 425 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 288 contacts are lost to follow-up and a total of 25 152 (20%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 858 (92%) out of 934 active contacts were monitored.




Figure 2: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 22 September 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 75 453 (59%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 21 072 (17%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- A total of 15 065 (12%) of the confirmed cases are among the 50 - 59 years group.
- The under 5 years age group make up 2 873 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 12 719 (10%) are above 60 years of age.

- Encourage the public to get vaccinated and strengthen community health awareness to encounter anti-vaccination information in circulation.
- Continue to give awareness on the importance of adhering to COVID-19 IPC measures; with the involvement of the Security Cluster.
