- A total of 129 187 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 5% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 68 726 (53%) have been recorded.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 4 362 (3%) are Health Workers, with no new confirmation today.
 - 3 642 (84%) State; 712 (16%) Private, 8 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 4 353 (99%) recoveries and 25 (0.6%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 97%.
- Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest number of cases with 41 893 (32%) and 18 481 (14%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 3 276 (92%) are COVID-19 deaths while 297 (8%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2.8%.




Figure 1: The 7 days moving average line chart for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 27 November 2021

- The highest peak of 12 787 (10%) cases was recorded during week 25 of 2021 (Figure 1).
- After a peak in epi-week 25, the country has seen a gradual reduction in the average number of confirmed cases from 1 827 to 6 in epi-week 46.
- The number of cases have plateaued in the last twelve (12) weeks as seen in the graph.
- ➤ The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- Today (27/11/2021), 398 calls were answered.




Figure 2: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 27 November 2021



- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of sixteen (16) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP, Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre, ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory, MAXI, Medlink Laboratory Services and Biotech Medical.
- ➤ To date, 787 883 tests (including 14 397 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 147 256 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 31 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 11 regions.
- Cumulatively, 145 413 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 290 contacts are lost to follow-up and a total of 25 423 (20%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 43 (36%) out of 141 active contacts were monitored.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 76 301 (59%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of **21** 675 (17%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- A total of **15 262 (12%)** of the confirmed cases are among the 50 59 years group.
- The under 5 years age group make up 2 937 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 13 012 (10%) are above 60 years of age.
