# **HIGHLIGHTS/SITUATION UPDATE (11/12/2021)**

- A total of 133 090 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 5% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 70 877 (53%) have been recorded.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 4 565 (3%) are Health Workers, with 12 new confirmations today.
  - 3 816 (83%) State; 741 (16%) Private, 8 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
  - 4 361 (99%) recoveries and 25 (0.6%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 96%.
- Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest number of cases with 44 452 (33%) and 19 090 (14%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 3 277 (92%) are COVID-19 deaths while 300 (8%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2.7%.

### **EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUTATION IN NAMIBIA**

- Of the total confirmed cases, 79 438 (59%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 21 993 (17%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- A total of 15 527 (12%) of the confirmed cases are among the 50 - 59 years group.
- The under 5 years age group make up 2 974 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 13 158 (10%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 1: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 11 December 2021

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of sixteen (16) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NiP, Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre, ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory, MAXI, Medlink Laboratory Services and Biotech Medical.
- To date, **818 079** tests (including **14 935** re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 148 757 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 4 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 7 regions.
- Cumulatively, 146 148 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 290 contacts are lost to followup and a total of 25 586 (20%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 128 (13%) out of 980 active contacts were monitored.

- The highest peak of 12 787 (10%) cases was recorded during week 25 of 2021 (Figure 1).
- The country has started seeing an increase in the daily number of confirmed cases from 13 in epi-week 47 to 122 in epi-week 48.
- > The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- Today (11/12/2021), 435 calls were answered.




Figure 2: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 11 December 2021




Figure 3: The 7 days moving average line chart for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 11 December 2021
