- A total of 134 694 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 5% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 71 728 (53%) have been recorded.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 4 625 (3%) are Health Workers, with 30 new confirmations today.
 - 3 863 (84%) State; 754 (16%) Private, 8 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 4 361 (95%) recoveries and 25 (0.5%) deaths.
- The recovery rate now stands at 94%.
- Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest number of cases with 45 296 (33%) and 19 250 (14%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 3 279 (92%) are COVID-19 deaths while 301 (8%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2.7%.

EPIDEMIOLOGICAL SITUATION IN NAMIBIA

- Of the total confirmed cases, 80 662 (60%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 22 129 (17%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- A total of **15 672 (12%)** of the confirmed cases are among the 50 59 years group.
- The under 5 years age group make up 2 996 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 13 235 (10%) are above 60 years of age.




Figure 1: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases 14 December 2021



- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of sixteen (16) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP, Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre, ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory, MAXI, Medlink Laboratory Services and Biotech Medical.
- To date, **824 661** tests (including **15 189** re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 150 221 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 362 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 12 regions.
- Cumulatively, 146 917 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 290 contacts are lost to follow-up and a total of 25 756 (20%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 608 (35%) out of 1 574 active contacts were monitored.

- The highest peak of 12 787 (10%) cases was recorded during week 25 of 2021 (Figure 1).
- The country has started seeing an increase in the daily number of confirmed cases from 13 in epi-week 47 to 434 in epi-week 49.
- ➤ The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- Today (14/12/2021), 619 calls were answered.

Moving Average = 7-day total/7




Figure 3: The 7 days moving average line chart for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 14 December 2021

Encourage the public to get vaccinated and strengthen community health awareness to counteract anti-vaccination information in circulation.


