- ➤ A total of 140 449 cases have been recorded to-date, representing 5% of the total population (2 550 226).
- More female cases 74 735 (53%) have been recorded.
- Of the total confirmed cases, 4 778 (3%) are Health Workers, with 26 new confirmations today.
 - 3 994 (83%) State; 776 (16%) Private, 8 (0.2%) Non-Governmental Organizations.
 - 4 361 (92%) recoveries and 25 (0.5%) deaths.

- > The recovery rate now stands at 91%.
- Khomas and Erongo regions reported the highest number of cases with 47 487 (34%) and 20 505 (14%) respectively.
- Of the total fatalities, 3 282 (92%) are COVID-19 deaths while 307 (8%) are COVID-19 related deaths. The case fatality rate now stands at 2.6%.




Figure 1: Epi-curve for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 19 December 202

- The highest peak of 12 787 (9%) cases was recorded during week 25 of 2021 (Figure 1).
- The country has started seeing an increase in the daily number of confirmed cases from 13 in epi-week 47 to 918 in epi-week 49.
- The National Call Center continues operations for 24 hours daily.
- Today (19/12/2021), 501 calls were answered.




Figure 2: The 7 days moving average line chart for confirmed COVID-19 cases, 19 December 2021

- Of the total confirmed cases, 84 941 (60%) are in the 20-49 years age-brackets which constitutes the majority of the recorded cases.
- A total of 22 639 (16%) of the confirmed cases are among the 5-19 years category.
- A total of 16 209 (12%) of the confirmed cases are among the 50 - 59 years group.
- The under 5 years age group make up 3 070 (2%) of the total cases whereas, 13 590 (10%) are above 60 years of age.

- The laboratory testing capacity has been enhanced; with a total of nineteen (19) laboratories carrying out the testing of samples: NIP, Path-Care, UNAM Molecular, Central Veterinary Laboratory, Namib Poultry, NAMDEB, NamPath, Namibia Central Pathology, DiagnoLab, High Care, Alpha Medical Laboratory, Des-Jo Medical Test Centre, ProQuest Diagnostic Laboratory, MAXI, Medlink Laboratory Services, Biotech Medical, Covisure, Star Care, Soweto Medical Center.
- To date, 845 015 tests (including 15 925 re-tests) have been conducted by authorized laboratories.
- Since the beginning of the outbreak, 152 862 contacts of confirmed cases have been identified, 626 new contacts were identified within the last 24 hours from 10 regions.
- Cumulatively, 148 492 contacts have completed their monitoring period, while 290 contacts are lost to follow-up and a total of 26 069 (19%) contacts of confirmed cases have tested positive.
- Today, 692 (27%) out of 2 570 active contacts were monitored.




Figure 3: Age and Sex distribution of COVID-19 confirmed cases, 19 December 2021

RECOMMENDATIONS


Encourage the public to get vaccinated and strengthen community health awareness to counteract anti-vaccination information in circulation.
